# The National Government Fraud Economy At The Expense of The Poorest



MR. MANDEVILLE ROE, who has studied the Unemployment problem both in this and in other countries, shows that all the "scandals of the dole" are not on one side.

HEN the National Government, after an electoral victory so sweeping ¬as to have no parallel in history, was returned to office everybody understood we were in for a period of most drastic economy. For- the nation now had two alternatives only, either to pay up for the crimes, follies, and blunders of the Labour Government, or to behave like a fraudulent trader and go bankrupt.

By supporting the National Government the British people decided to do the honest thing, however unpleasant it might be. The National Government demanded sacrifices from all, and on that basis of equality of sacrifice the whole country was prepared for privations even as great as those demanded in War. The Government, however, has not even attempted to achieve equality of sacrifice.

#### What is Economy?

Some people seem to think that economy merely means saving money, regardless of how it is saved, or what material losses- are sustained in saving it. That is an utterly false definition, but it is unfortunately the one which the National Government has embraced with eagerness. As I once heard Mr. Pethick, Lawrence point out in the House of Commons, that neither the present administration nor the last wild riot of Socialism (led by the same Right Honourable Gentleman as lulls the present Government) gave a thought to this absolutely first principle of public affairs.

The abolition of the "genuinely seeking work" clause. I have elsewhere denounced that clause, and am prepared to denounce it again, because the need for such a clause indicates the utter failure of the whole system of Labour. Exchanges, which should be the clearing houses for jobs and men.

Yet without that clause in a state of affairs such as we have had, Unemployed Insurance Benefit is robbed of all meaning and those who receive it become State pensioner& Need I ask if they are likely to be fit for work, should they ever be lucky enough to get it, after that? The Socialist Party was, as rapidly as it could, producing a nation of- paupers, and it began by pauperising the unemployed!

The National Government is completing the pauperization; indeed, it is so successful that unless the process is in some way checked it will produce an Outlaw Class of society which, if it once organizes itself, can only lead to absolute anarchy and lawlessness.

Every mean, contemptible, and petty expedient is adopted to remove men from Unemployment Benefit, or from the receipt of aid from the Public Assistance Committees. In this unsavoury work public

unpleasant it might be. The National officials who really have no connection with Government demanded sacrifices from all, the problems at all.

When asked if there were any men present looking for a job. Several people in the public gallery put up their hands, and an official ofthe court took their names and addresses. On-going to the Labour Exchanges these men were suspended from benefit on the ground that they were wasting their time in a police court when they should have been looking for work!

Such efforts as this at economy are utterly mean and contemptible. Not merely are public officials doing all they can to remove men from benefit, but there is also private active support for the official attitude, which appears to be that the figures of unemployment must be-reduced by fair means or foul.

An appeal was made from the plat-form of a cinema one afternoon for any men in the audience seeking jobs, and that incident also had an exactly similar result to that in the case I have just cited.

I can well imagine that some of my fire-side critics will bark, "Serve 'em right!" when they hear- that the unemployed who suffered were enjoying themselves in the police-court or the cinema. All I have to say to those critics is, "If you lost your job or all your money to-morrow, how would you like to look for work in present conditions? Do you think you would succeed? I know you would not; the work is not there!" Those "Dole" Scandals!

At frequent intervals the newspapers regale us with stories of men who, having hundreds, of pounds in the bank, peacefully lived on Unemployment Insurance Benefit, or relief, for years. There are over two million unemployed; it is not surprising to find one or two black sheep in such a very large flock! But to hear the backwoodsmen of the Service Clubs talking you would imagine the entire two million were a gang of abandoned thieves.

Fortunately, we know who the thieves are in our civilization, although we do nothing about it. They are the Guinea-Pigs who live on interest; they toil nor neither do they spin. If they have worked and retired they are entitled to do so. Yet those who, in virtue of being

sons of their fathers, inherit comfortable incomes for which they have to do nothing, are people of whose means any Government is entitled to take a very drastic toll, particularly when there are millions unable to keep themselves by the labour of their hands.

Instead of that, our National Government, zealous- for "equality of sacrifice," plunged its greedy hands into the few shillings a week of the day-labourer, the small income from investment of the widow and orphan, the meagre salaries of those teachers who are paid less than dustmen but have to keep up the appearance of being well-to-do or they do not get jobs.- Nothing was safe,- nothing was sacred, from the great Economy Ramp of the National- Government.

I know not if this be a land fit for heroes, but I do know, so far as the ordinary working people and the unemployed are concerned, that it is a land full of heroes.

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### A LATE CONVERT

IR OSWALD MOSLEY has the Courage to Praise Fascism. Many readers will have observed with surprise the long- article contributed- by Sir Oswald Mosley to The Daily Mail in which he tells English people candidly, impartially, and concisely, what Fascism has meant for Italy, and what it has, done to "raise up- the Italian people morally and spiritually," as-Mussolini promised.

Not so long ago Sir Oswald was sitting among the Red-raggers of the Clydeside. He is not ashamed to acknowledge he was wrong. That is an act which requires courage. Sir Oswald has courage. What is more, Sir Oswald is not ashamed to admit that as he gets older, he learns.

By doing that Sir Oswald has definitely lifted himself out of the rut which contains all the normal politicians. It is rare to find a politician capable of learning, and still more rare to find one who will admit that he has not known everything there is to know from the- day he left his cradle—but some of them have never left it, intellectually! And others have gone back to it.

The leader of the New Party has, in short, become a Fascist in theory, if not in name, whether his courage will extend as far as owning the name with pride remains to be seen. At all events he has shown that the House of Commons is not such a Sodom and Gomorrah as to contain no righteous men.

Loyalty is not everything. Loyalty will not cure unemployment; loyalty will not solve the adverse balance of trade. New political measures are required, and the only new are Fascist ones. If Sir Oswald Mosley has really recognized that, then he is on the high road to being of service to his country.

One word of warning to him and his friends. The British public loathes one thing above all others in its statesmen: Insincerity. If any man tries to convert the public to Fascism by calling it something- else that man is doomed to failure. The British people are not fools; great though the prejudice against Fascism may be on the ground that it is "foreign," the public would rather the supporters of that doctrine had the courage to call their proposals by their right name.

Sir Oswald Mosley has shown the courage to face a Hyde Park mob, and we are proud to think he had British Fascists among those who fought to save his Union Jack. We are sure he will also have the courage to tell the British public that it is Fascism, and Fascism alone, which can save the country from collapse.

**VER** since the beginning of time the problem which has most interested mankind has been that of unravelling the future. All generations have alike been obsessed with the desire to know their own fate, in matters great and small. **HE** veil of false glory which propagandists have laid over the grim horrors of Sovietism has- at last been torn aside by the people who live there.

"The housing conditions of barracks No. 4 are very bad. Married and single men live in that barracks. The room is so cold that the workers have to sleep in their clothes. Some of the windows have no panes. The barracks are dirty and full of parasites. From day to day the, workers do not receive, goods to which so-called democratic constitution in imitation they are entitled."

"The supply of workers with food is appalling. The queues are endless and the workers prefer to do without boots and other manufactured goods rather than stand for hours in front of the shop":

British and Russian Miners, Compare Notes!

The hardships of our own miners, great as they have been, pale into insignificance compared with the working conditions of their Russian "comrades." This is a description of communal dining-room at one Russian mine:-

"Five hundred miners have to share three glasses and nine spoons. The building workers attached to that mine have a diningroom which possesses no roof. Rain and snow fall down in the food, and dirty puddles exist on benches and tables." Russia, in short, is inflicting on her people worse conditions than any- we underwent during the War. Cast your mind back to those days of food-queues and privation, and then remember Sovietism is worse than that. Do you want that here?

# THE MAKERS OF **MODERN ITALY** WHAT NAPOLEON **FORESAW**

("The Makers of Modern Italy, Napoleon—Mussolini," by Sir J. A. R. Marriott; Oxford University Press, 10/-)

**☐ IR** John Marriott has done very wisely to bring up to date his earlier study of the Risorgimento, particularly- as the advent of Fascism has meant the completion of that great historic movement and we are now able to regard the development of Italy in the truly historic sense.

Before the Great War there was an air of being unfinished about the Kingdom of Italy which can only be explained by the existence of a of English and other foreign models.

Sir John, whose delineation of historical characters and their political motives has long been renowned, shows how unsuitable this was to Italy and how Lecky and others who wrote of the Risorgimento before him naturally regarded Italy as falling away from the high ideals of nationalism.

It is to Napoleon,- however, more than, any other one person, that Italy owes her separate existence as a great nation to-day. As Sir John Marriott points out, he was more than half Italian-- himself, and he dreamed of a great Italian Kingdom or Empire to which his stepson, Eugene Beauharnais, should succeed. It does not affect the argument at all that he later partitioned Italy himself and allowed the Papal State to continue in existence; he had had the idea, and he had shown the Italians that he could execute it if he liked.

Sir John Marriott, in this brilliant book, which every Fascist should read, traces how theseed Napoleon planted in the Italian mind grew and unfolded into a great tree, despite the storms of revolution, civil war, and Austrian repression. This work will enhance the reputation—already great—of our most prominent living historian.

Napoleon could not foresee Mussolini, but he could and he did see Italy strong under a strong man. So it was that he prepared the way for Fascism, a way which was to be thorny with anarchy, republicanism, assassinations, and civil wars, until finally, in 1921, Italy found her own soul in the black legions of Fascisti. Napoleon had been dead exactly a hundred years, and here at last was his successor.

"The Jews are told that they are still a small minority in South Africa and have no right to attempt to dictate to the majority."

The South African Immigration Restriction Bill was a memorable event, for it united the white races regardless of the distinction of British and Dutch, or of party divisions. The Jews then stirred up the black population to make demonstrations, but fortunately the local police kept the situation in hand despite the use of stones and knives.

#### And then—Silence

That was all the British public were allowed to know by their Jewish masters until a paper the Jews cannot gag — The Patriot informed its readers on the 10th December of the warning given by the South African Minister of the Interior (Dr. Malan) to the Jews, "I want to warn them that if they want to hit us, they may be assured we will hit back."

Yet none of the great British dailies took any further notice of the question. England must not know that the Jews had tried to conquer South. Africa!

Meanwhile events had moved fast in South Africa; the Jewish Board of Deputies met and decided to take action against Dr. Malan, but the nature of that action they did not disclose to the Press (Cape Argus, November 4th, 1931). How domineering the Jew is by nature is seen by what followed. A deputation visited. Dr. Malan and handed him what amounted to an ultimatum. 'They were really rather stupid; they categorically denied facts of which the Government had definite information, and it was generally apparent that they were scared.

So here we have another case to put beside that of Henry Ford, where a strong Gentile champion has suddenly by this Asiatic power been forced into a very humiliating surrender.

#### The Stupid Jew

Now, however, the limitation of the. Jew's mentality becomes apparent. He believes in feeding the Gentile public on anything favourable to himself, as was stated again and again in the Protocols. He also believes, when the occasion offers, in intimidating the Gentiles. In this instance, however, by keeping the whole business out of the English Press he has deprived himself of a rather fine opportunity of showing his own power.

For he cannot tell the story of Dr. Malan's surrender without telling that of his own attempt to conquer South Africa. Poor Ikey! Truly the way of the transgressor is hard.

The hatred of the Chinese at the time of the Boxer Rising was all directed against Europeans; now the situation is complicated by the East facing- the East.

What is more, both the yellow races possess a civilization, and a degree of organization, which has never appeared before. They are, in short; capable of doing infinite harm both to themselves and to all the other nations of the world. The Meaning of Concessions.

While the Japanese have no doubt acted under great provocation, some-what similar to that which our own Government has so timidly endured for years in India, the Chinese also have a genuine grievance, and one which the other nations holding Concessions in Shanghai need never have allowed to occur.

It is recognized by Treaty that the foreign settlements in Shanghai are not Chinese soil, but that of the countries whose subjects occupy the Concessions. Those Concessions have therefore their own Government and their own means of carrying it out quite independently of the Chinese authorities, who have no business whatever, and who hold no rule, within the Concessions.

Among these nations holding Concessions are the Japanese. They; in common with everybody else, recognize the neutrality of the Concessions. Yet they launched their attack on the Chinese town of Shanghai from a basewithin the International Settlement! This was a high-handed action which could- and which should never- have been undertaken. Quite apart from the question of the territorial rights of the Concessions, it of necessity involves in the Chinese mind an accusation against all the other Powers of having aided the Japanese forces by allowing them to use such a base. A word from any representative of the Powers at the right time, but particularly a word from the-British Government as the senior, having the longest-standing relations of this sort with China, would have been sufficient to deter the Japanese.

### The Secret of American **Enmity to Japan**

As was shown in Henry Ford's book, "The International Jew," which he afterwards withdrew under Hebrew pressure, America is largely in the hands of the Jews even in the sphere of politics. Now there is one civilized country in the world where the Jew is not welcome, and is rightly bundled about his unsavoury business. That is Japan, and, so the American Press has been dragooned into- a slanging campaign against the Japanese which is bound sooner or later to lead to trouble.

Meanwhile, with shells falling into the International Settlement at Shanghai the League of Nations—comfortably out of at Geneva—discusses Disarmament! Among the proposals made is one for the total abolition of aircraft for warlike purposes. Chapei is still blazing from Japanese incendiary bombs as we write.

Last year the manoeuvres at Spezia conclusively proved the uselessness of land and sea defences against such attacks. Yet the civilians at Geneva will never learn that the only weapons men will throw away are those which are no use. It is a fact which should be obvious. Nobody dreams of proposing a motion to the Conference urging the abolition of the cross-bow. Time has abolished it already!

What, then is the course to take! Are the nations to go on with costly and unproductive expenditure demanded by heavy armaments? Is there no hope of relief? There is, but not by the Geneva way. Not till the backwardnations have all reached a stage of civilization equal to our own will Disarmament be anything but a crime against civilization as a whole.

And that crime rests upon the souls of the old women of Geneva and their myrmidons over here, the League of Nations Union!

# BRITISH FASCIST INVESTITURE

HE British Fascists are holding an investiture at the Admiral's Cabin, Strand, W.C.2., on February 8th, at 8 p.m., when several officers and members will be decorated with the Order of the Fasces for their devoted service to the cause of King and Country.

This Order was founded shortly after the end of the General Strike, when it was felt some recognition should be granted for the sterling services rendered at that time. While all did their very best and did it loyally and with a will, outstanding merit was honoured in this way.

There are three classes of the Order, the decoration being wrought in gold, silver, or bronze. At the forthcoming Investiture only one gold order is being awarded. It goes to Col. H. W. Johnston, the O.C. Men's Units.

At the meeting the new British, Fascist Hymn, by A/Commr. Mandeville Roe, will be sung for the first time in public. It is set to the inspiring tune "Giovinezza" (Youth).

Can we "compel" the abolition of submarines upon the nations of the world? Hardly, if the "crisis" and "Gold Standard " are real; and yet we would advise other nations to scrap a weapon which is of no value to ourselves, though it was, and may again be, our greatest menace; while it may remain for the others their surest means of defence in its offensive potentiality against the slender shreds which hold our Empire and the World's security together. To talk of "Humanity" as the reason for abolishing a thing of which one is dread afraid is plain HUMBUG, and we may count upon it that no power will see the gesture otherwise; while they secretly scoff at our stupidity in our free disbursement of maritime privilege, which, and if we forget it others do not, is the true and only basis of "SEA POWER."

\* \* \* \* \*

Lacking- that strength and security of pre-war days, we can no more afford "humbug" than we can the altruistic gestures of a prosperous era. So long as big business (for which read international flum-jummery) and politicians expect to overcome a crisis by asking merchant seamen to accept reductions on their already ridiculous remunerations, lay the lodging-houses of Invergordon open to all agitators anxious to take advantage of cuts in Naval pay, and by the continuation of a policy of "open harbours" and "what is for my seaman is even more so for yours," so long may we anticipate our lot becoming worse.

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
